



Where are we?

 - St. Lawrence, Rush Lake




Who are we?

 - St. Lawrence: 185 families




Strengths

- "Manageable"
 - 2 priests, 4 parishes (1 pastor, 1 parochial vicar).
 - 2 deacons, and one in formation.
- It's a natural setup, and has a history that goes back to 2004 and earlier.
- The Perham Catholic Cluster
 - 3 priests, 5 parishes
 - St. Stan's closed in October 2009
- Confirmations and retreats together for years.

St. Henry's Area School

- St. Henry, St. Lawrence, and Sacred Heart.
 - Kids are from these parishes, along with Holy Cross and St. James in Maine.
 - Pre-K through 6th grade
- 148 total students this year (87 kids 18 years ago).
- Established in 1883, and the new school was completed in 2022.




Eucharistic Revival

Struggles and Challenges

- #1 concern: fear of losing parish identity... dissolving parish councils a concern for people.
- Finding new volunteers... the same people always seem to step up.
- Rotating clergy every weekend can create a sense of inconsistency.
- Confusion regarding ACCs in general:
 - Especially regarding the end goal.
 - People seem to sense that it's trying to solve a problem that didn't exist up here.



Fr. George's Priorities

- Spiritual Growth and Evangelization
 - Reaching out to the baptized, but uncatechized and unevangelized.
 - Especially those who have drifted away.
 - Making faith formation relevant and the foundation for living out the moral and social teaching of the Church.
- Hospitality and Unity
 - Create a welcoming environment that includes all members and visitors to the NCACC.
 - Encourage families to participate.
 - Bringing parishes together, while keeping and respecting each one's uniqueness and individuality.
