As a result of this training, participants will be able to:

- meet people where they are at in the pew, at home, on the margins;
- describe Benedictine foundations for caregiving;
- practice non-judgmental listening;
- · begin making pastoral visits; and
- form prayerful communities to encourage and nourish caregivers.

Benedictine Spirituality

When Benedict of Nursia wrote a Rule for the monks of his monastery in sixth century Italy, he was encouraging those seek God together in community.

1500 years later that Rule is still being observed all around the world, wherever people draw on time-tested Benedictine wisdom.

Benedict's Rule equips people to "listen with the ear of the heart," a discipline supported by spiritual practices like these:

- Lectio & Visio Divina (sacred reading)
- Caring Community
- Radical Hospitality
- Discerning Gifts & Calling
- Conversatio Morum (transforming way of life)

These ancient Benedictine practices come together in the ministry of pastoral care—especially in **the art of listening**.



Training Lay Pastoral Caregivers

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Community of Hope International

Bridge-Builders for a Thriving Mission chose to partner with Community of Hope International (COHI) because of the organization's expertise and rootedness in Benedictine spirituality. COHI has been equipping lay people worldwide to serve in all forms of pastoral care, providing ecumenical training materials in English, Spanish, and French. COHI sees pastoral care as a way to encounter Christ in one another, being present to a person in spiritual need with compassionate and nonjudgmental listening.

Through ongoing spiritual formation and practical lessons on caregiving, members learn to integrate theological reflection and practice with their experiences of ministering to others.

Initial Training

The fourteen modules used in training cover topics both theoretical and practical, ranging from the tenets of Benedictine Spirituality to practical instruction in making a pastoral care visit. The goal of training is to awaken participants to God's call and discover their spiritual gifts for ministry.

"This training is about the skills and the practices of spiritual life that prepare each one of us to be open and hospitable to the presence of Christ in the other person . . . Our prayer is that the stranger will receive us and see the Christ in us."

Ongoing Circles of Care

Following the training, Circles of Care continue to meet, nurturing and sustaining a Benedictine sense of community. Lay pastoral caregivers meet monthly in Christ-centered circles to pray, reflect, and nourish caregivers for the ongoing ministry of listening.
